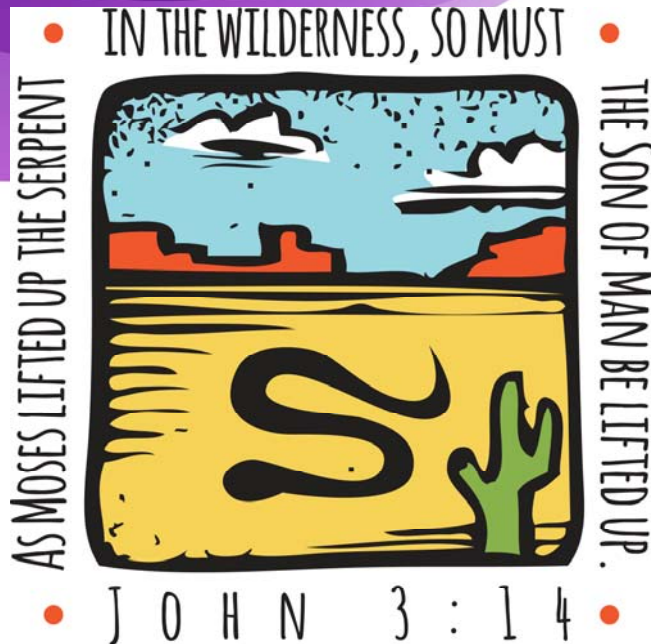

and a process of meaningful learning, discussion and discernment.



PERIOD OF PURIFICATION & ENLIGHTENMENT

The **third phase of preparation** takes place during Lent.

At this time we set aside our book learning and enter into a time of more intense spiritual growth, examining our lives, and determining where God is calling us.

We look at the world and ourselves with the eyes of faith and we join in the celebration of Holy Week and Easter.

A **Candidate** is a baptized* Christian who is discerning a decision to join the Catholic Church.

A **Catechumen** is an unbaptized* person who is discerning a decision to join the Catholic Faith.

Discernment is supported with faith formation through a process known as **RCIA**.

*All trinitarian baptisms are recognized, meaning a baptism using the words
"In that name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit."

Pastoral and Finance Councils

"How can we make this big parish feel small?" Over 4,400 people - part of over 1400 families belong to Resurrection Parish. Our Mission is to grow in our own faith, deepen our roots in our faith, and deepen the relationship that each one of us has with Christ and with each other in Christ. As well, we want to reach beyond the walls of our church and our current parishioners, into our community, to share and spread God's love, joy and Word to our neighbors and community.

Pastoral Council

Vice Chair is responsible to assist the Pastoral Chair with pastoral council duties and temporarily assume these duties when the Chair is absent. This includes keeping parishioners informed and developing and maintaining good relations between parishioners and the parish organizations, and other parishes and the public.

Ministry of Care The Ministry of Care brings the spirit of compassion and presence to the sick, needy and bereaved of our community in the name of Christ and His church. Our certified Ministers of Care visit the sick and bring Eucharist to the hospitals, homebound, nursing homes and living centers. All training necessary to become a Minister of Care will be provided and we need your help.

Stewardship is responsible for creating awareness in all parishioners that everything we have comes from God: our life, our talents, our abilities, our intellectual gifts, our resources, and our holiness. There is only one chair who serves on both Pastoral and Finance Councils.

Recorder is responsible to assist the Pastoral Chair at pastoral council meetings. Duties include recording the meeting minutes and providing them to the Pastoral Chair for distribution to the committee

Finance Council

Finance Council Vice Chair assists the Finance Chair with leading the advisory body responsible for safeguarding the finances and assets of Resurrection Parish and ensuring financial data is communicated to pastor, pastoral council and sub-committees and all other affected parties. A business background, especially financial and accountings skills, is valuable.

Recording Secretary is responsible to assist the Finance Council Chair at Finance Council meetings. Duties include recording the meeting minutes and providing them to the Finance Council Chair for distribution to the committee

Hall and Catering This committee is responsible for working with the priest, parish staff (if any), volunteers, as well as church organizations for all hall and catering activities undertaken by the church. To ensure all policies and procedures are current and being carried out.

Fundraising develops and coordinates fundraising activities to raise funds to augment financial needs of the parish.

Warm Welcome Coalition



Support Needed for Warm Welcome Centre

Local faith communities, organizations and concerned citizens have come together, recognizing the crisis for the houseless community and the severe cold weather coming. The Warm Welcome Coalition celebrates the funding announced to Carmichael Outreach from the Saskatchewan Government and the City of Regina for an overnight warming centre in Regina. Carmichael Outreach has offered their space and has developed a budget for staffing and managing this project. The centre will be open from 11pm to 7am, 7 days a week, from January to May 2024. The Warm Welcome Centre expects to provide space for up to 60 people at the start. We see this as addressing an immediate need while we continue to press the governments for a more permanent solution to houselessness, i.e. affordable housing with wraparound supports (Housing First).

We are now looking for volunteers to support the Carmichael staff overnight and various donors (faith communities and individuals) to donate food and beverages.

Volunteers should contact Carmichael Outreach's volunteer coordinator at <https://carmichaeloutreach.ca/volunteer/>. All volunteers must have a current police records check. Volunteers will also be asked to attend an orientation.

Donors will be primarily from faith communities. Donations could include items such as coffee/tea and supplies, juice, and snacks (e.g. muffins, sandwiches, baking, fruit, etc.) with enough for 60 people. Donations will be received during the daytime hours. No deliveries can be accepted at night for security reasons.
