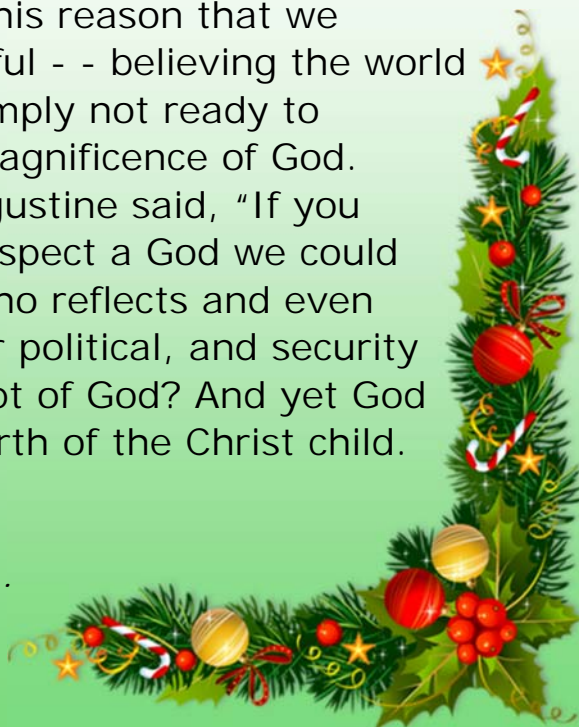
It is not hard for us to name the things that cause us worry, anxiety, or fear in our lives - - be it anxiety over the well-being of your loved ones, a difficult medical diagnosis, financial uncertainty, a mental health issue, a family member who has become estranged, among the many other struggles and fears we face each day. Add to this the reality of living in a society that in many ways appears to be increasingly confused in its moral values. Our moral convictions seem to be more and more questioned and relativized by the world around us.

It is in our faith that we are called to find our stabilization. We are invited to place all of our trust in a God who walks with us and helps us navigate through the darkness.

This great revelation is hard to live by because we normally find it difficult not to default to our own limited image of God which is. In many ways we have created a God who fits into our small systems and our understanding of God. We want to be in charge and project our image of God on God who is greater than our cultures and our immediate needs.

Richard Rohr writes, 'If God is always Mystery, then God is always in some way unfamiliar, beyond what we are used to, beyond our comfort zone, beyond what we can explain our understand.' Perhaps it is for this reason that we sometimes doubt God or become anxious and fearful - - believing the world has spun out of control and we feel lost. We are simply not ready to comprehend the totality and utter simplicity and magnificence of God. Rohr goes on to say, 'In the fourth century, St. Augustine said, "If you comprehend it, it is not God." Yet could we truly respect a God we could comprehend? And yet very often we want a God who reflects and even confirms our culture, our biases, our economic, our political, and security systems'. Does that not undermine the very concept of God? And yet God has revealed God's self to humanity through the birth of the Christ child.

We often hear that God meets us where we are at. When we ponder the Incarnation we see our God doing exactly that. He reveals Himself to us in the most precious reality that we, as human beings can know and experience - - in the preciousness of an infant child. In spite of all the struggles of life we face, this season reminds us that our Lord has come into our world. Our God lives among us and at the same time is utterly transcendent. He comes to us as one of us, tiny, vulnerable, seemingly entirely dependent upon human beings for care and protection - - the very image of innocence, purity and new life. The eyes of a child radiate unburdened openness, fascination, and innocence.

The image of an infant child speaks to us of hope and promise for the future. It is the one image that directs us toward the experience of the same love and softness of heart that God has for each one of us.....as helpless precious loveable children. We are all helpless vulnerable children of God with a great dignity and potential for great love. What that great dignity means and how it will unfold has yet to be revealed to us. At the end of his life Jesus cries out, 'Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.' (Luke 23:46) At the beginning of Jesus' earthly life, the Father entrusts His Son into the hands of humanity. What a priceless gift exchange between Father and Son, with all peoples invited right into the middle of that love through the Holy Spirit. Our God's presence is manifested in and through our participation in countless ways, both visibly and invisibly.

As we enter into the Christmas season, may our image of God open up to the infinite mystery of life, bringing us in touch with the child of God within, and may it foster a desire to share that love openly.

May Christ's Presence and Peace help us put the heaviness and worries of life into proper perspective - - that is, into the Hands of our Creator God who knows firsthand the struggles of life and offers us the gift of new life in Him.

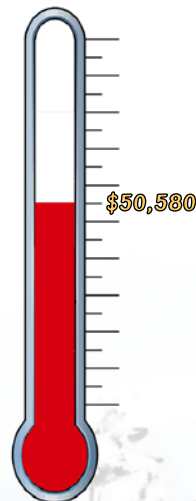

On Saturday, December 28th at 7:00 pm we will gather across the drive from the Legislative Building to pray the Rosary in atonement for the sins of abortion. We are calling upon our gracious Mother Mary in prayer **to change the hearts and minds of those who create and uphold unjust laws in Saskatchewan.**

Media and elected officials are not invited; it is not a protest but a prayer vigil that lasts about half an hour. There will be a short introduction and then the Rosary.

Please bring two or three battery-operated tea candles for others who may have forgotten to bring their candle or in case they stop working due to cold weather. Dress for the weather (ie: snow suits if really cold and hand warmers).

Message - Abortion is not healthcare and we denounce King Herod Laws.

Abortion is the main message but we are fighting against MAiD as well.

The unjust law of legalizing abortion & MAiD due to the following:

- abortion & MAiD are not healthcare;
- it is unjust to ask citizens to pay for the procedures of abortion & MAiD via taxes
- it does not create a better community due to the psychological impact of both procedures.

Christmas Greetings from Archbishop Don

*W*arm greetings to you all as we prepare to celebrate the Lord's birth in this tumultuous year of 2024. I want to start with a couple of quotes which have been meaningful to me over the years, and which aren't very Christmassy, but they do set a framework for understanding what Christmas and the Incarnation bring to us. The first is from the great American writer Annie Dillard, who in processing a very harsh experience, writes: "it is late, a late time to be living."

In the midst of the wars which continue on relentlessly in our world, the over 100 million refugees and displaced persons, amidst the deep and polarizing differences which only seem to be getting more entrenched throughout the Western world, it does seem like a late, late time to be living.

The other quote comes from C. S. Lewis, who is writing about the impact of his mother's death when he was still a child: "With my mother's death all settled happiness, all that was tranquil and reliable, disappeared from my life. There was to be much fun, many pleasures... but no more of the old security. It was sea and islands now; the great continent had sunk like Atlantis."

I offer those reflections because I think they help name the experience today that the foundations on which our society, and indeed our world, have been built upon, now seem very shaky. The collective values which have sought to uphold human dignity and the value of each human person, advancing in some ways, are deeply threatened in others. Trying to describe this moment in history, C. S. Lewis's words come to mind: it is all sea and islands now.

But faith offers a different kind of foundation, not rooted in a general and perhaps naive sense that things are ever progressing in a good direction. Rather, faith grounds us in God's capacity and desire to enter into our history in all its struggles, and bring a different kind of transformation. The birth of Jesus, the coming of God in the flesh, proclaims God's desire to be near us, to walk with us, to show us a face of incredible mercy and great tenderness. This is the foundation on which we can live with hope and joy, despite shakiness of the moral and political landscape with which we live. I am sure that at the time of Jesus's birth, in the midst of tremendous political instability and oppression, it also felt like a late time to be living. The fact is, God has created us to live here and now, trusting that God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is here with us in the mess and fray, in this time and place.

Finally, I invite you to consider one more thing, which has to do with the way that God has come into the world in Jesus. If you were all powerful and trying to change the world, trying to bring about a kingdom of peace and justice, seeking to create a communion of joy among all peoples, would you do so by sending a baby into the world? Would you step aside from your power and might and send yourself in vulnerability and hiddenness?

This is what God does. This is who our God is. This is how God is revealed to us. In the most intimate, tender, vulnerable way imaginable. God has come to walk with us. This Christmas season, I invite you to ponder that, and to reflect upon the incredible mercy and compassion that is revealed there. And put a hold on all temptations to discouragement or despair. And look at what God is doing. Then trust in that, find joy in that, and try to do things God's way, to live and act in the way God opens up before us, with great trust and hope, joy and mercy.

Merry Christmas to you all! May you know the great blessings of the Christ Child!
