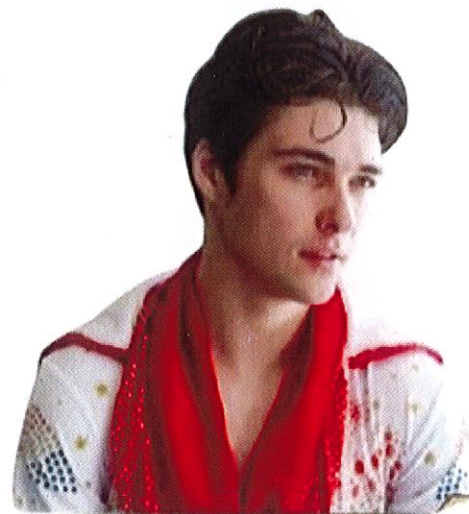

What makes peppers hot? The main cause of the heat in peppers is the chemical compound capsaicin, which binds with pain receptors in our tissue, causing a burning sensation. Scientists originally thought capsaicin was in peppers to deter animals from eating them. However, more recent research indicates that capsaicin is likely produced to prevent insect damage and fungal growth within the peppers. Capsaicin binds with certain pain receptors, causing the familiar sensation of heat. However, it is not an actual burn. No damage is caused to the tissue, and instead it just feels painful.
