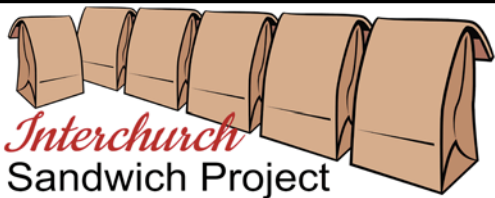

To ensure that the RCIA Candidates and Catechumens are well-served on their discernment journey, the parish has a need for volunteers to assist in the following capacities:

Bible Tabbing

Commitment: once, early November

Time Commitment: time to tab Bible

- Tab Bible

Catechists

Commitment: once, may choose to present more than once

Time Commitment: preparation plus presentation of approximately 20 minutes, Q&A to follow on scheduled Wednesday

- Present church teachings on a pre-determined topic which includes key points
- Topic and date to be chosen in consultation with the RCIA Coordinator and Catechist Coordinator
- Content review with Pastoral Team and approach review with Catechist Coordinator a minimum of two weeks before presentation
- Specific points to be covered (3-5) in the session are provided as guidance for what is presented

Period Needed: Catechumenate

Support Provided: Catechist Training Session, 3-5 key points to be presented, materials to gather presentation content, Priest & RCIA Coordinator to assist with preparation and session questions

Breaking open the word through mass Dismissal

Commitment: once, per rotation of all volunteers, but flexible

Time Commitment: Week-end Mass, dismissal after Liturgy of the Word, Mass time will rotate each week, approx. 20 min

- Break Open the Word with the Catechumens and Candidates
- Reflect on the word of God just heard at Mass in the Liturgy of the Word
- Help the Catechumens and Candidates hear how God is speaking to directly them
- Dismissal has a specified structure (training is provided)

Period Needed: Catechumenate

Support Provided: Dismissal Training Session, Dismissal Process Outline

Photographer

Commitment: events where photos are required, as per the photo plan, and preparing Photo USB

Time Commitment: attend events where photos are planned and prepare "photo USB"

- Work with RCIA and sponsor coordinators in preparing the photo plan
- Takes pictures according to photo plan
- Selects photos and prepares USB for RCIA participants
- Finds and manages support photographers, if replacement/additional photographers are needed

Period Needed: All periods

Support Provided: Dates and times for all occasions when photos are needed

Prayer team

Commitment: include assigned candidate, sponsor, team member in your prayers, prefer daily

Time Commitment: an additional prayer during your personal prayer time

- Pray for assigned Candidate for the duration of their journey in RCIA.
- Pray for assigned Sponsor as they journey with their RCIA Candidate
- Pray for the RCIA team, volunteers as they lead the Candidates and Sponsors

Period Needed: Inquiry, Catechumenate, Purification & Enlightenment

Support Provided: Prayer suggestions, sample prayers, prayer needs for each period at change of period

Snack

Commitment: once per rotation of all volunteers, but flexible

Time Commitment: dependent on the snack you chose

- Provide snack for the RCIA sessions, with the exception of during Lent

Period Needed: Inquiry, Catechumenate, Mystagogy

Support Provided: Allergy List Dietary restrictions would be communicated in advance

Sponsor

Commitment: every second during RCIA, follow up in year following Confirmation

Time Commitment: 6:45 - 9:00 Wednesdays, Candidate time: weekly touch base, volunteer in parish events, scheduled Sponsor Meetings (max 4)

- Accompany and support a Candidate on their journey including to RCIA Sessions, Mass and other scheduled activities
- Expose Candidate to other church activities (e.g. Bible study, faith morning, CWL / K of C)
- Participate in Rites

Eradicating the Demand with Technology: One Buyer at a Time

On Monday, September 16 at 11:00 AM, join the Sexual Exploitation Working Group of the Canadian Council of Churches for the second of three webinars!

One of the priorities of the Commission on Justice and Peace Sexual Exploitation Working Group is to educate, advocate, and theologically reflect on the area of sexual exploitation and demand reduction. True justice requires reducing the demand. The demand for paid sexual services is what fuels sex trafficking. Minimize demand: minimize the need for vulnerable individuals to be exploited to meet the demand.

Our guest speaker, Brian Rae, grew up in North Africa where he developed a heart for justice at a young age, inspiring him to pursue a legal career. After passing the bar exams, Brian chose to set aside his legal career to focus on combating sex trafficking through technology and compassionate care. Now based in Victoria, BC, he leads Buyer Resist, a technology organization dedicated to eliminating the demand for sex trafficking. At the heart of Buyer Resist's efforts is an artificial intelligence-powered chatbot that intercepts men who are buying sex and guides them towards recovery from sexual addiction and brokenness.
